

*You will need to be aware that this section of Hebrews Chapter 10 is addressing those who are among the genuine believers and are identifying with them but are not among those who fully trust in Jesus Christ alone. Their confidence in the truth about Christ is not steadfast. Their point of trust and reliance can still be changed or turned from faith in Christ blood and His resurrection only.

- What do reproaches and afflictions have to do with becoming a gazingstock?
- Can a person become companions of others who are going through sufferings and become a part of the suffering?
- Have you ever been a companion of others that you were actually like them?
- Did you experience other people's reaction to your companions?
- Would you call this God's making a distinction between you and them?

Hebrews 10:34

- Can a person become compassionate, giving, with a heavenly hope, without complete faith and not be steadfast in one's heart?
- Can you become like others in practice, belief, and faith and not be steadfast in one's heart?

Hebrews 10:35

- Can a person cast away confidence or change their point of trust and confidence?
- Does this make Christ of none effect when a person's belief can be changed?
- What reward is spoken of here?

Hebrews 10:36-37

- Why do we need patience concerning the will of God?
- What does Christ coming have to do with God's promise?
