

**Hebrews 4:6**

- What is the one thing that keeps people from entering into God's rest?
- Would there be one way then that some do enter into God's rest or finished work?
- How would people be provided the opportunity to enter or not enter God's rest?

**Hebrews 4:7**

- Is the possibility still available for people to enter into God's finished work?
- Is this possibility limited in time?
- How does God extend this possibility to mankind?
- What would cause a person to resist God while this opportunity is available?

**Hebrews 4:8**

- When Joshua took over leadership of God's people following Moses' death, did the people under Joshua's leadership ever experience a complete rest?
- Do you experience a complete rest or confidence in God's finished work under the spiritual leadership you follow?
- Like Joshua, who spoke of a coming time when God will fully and completely give His people rest from all adversity and labor. Does your spiritual leadership help you to have this kind of confidence in God's work, or are you responsible to complete the work?

**Hebrews 4:9**

- Is there a finished work reserved for God's people in which they could forever trust?
- Is keeping the Sabbath day just a physical ceasing from labor for one day?
- Or, is keeping the Sabbath an inward state of rest because one has ceased from his own effort to complete and accomplish his relationship and fellowship with God trusting in Jesus that He finished the work required for this?

**Hebrews 4:10**

- Does this verse explain the true meaning of keeping the Sabbath?
- Can a person enter into God's rest or the work He accomplished through Jesus Christ by belief only?
- Is a person's confidence in God's work through Jesus revealed in his ceasing from his own effort to accomplish this?
- Did God rest when He finished His work?

**Belief mixed with confidence requires a skill in spiritual communication and visible accomplishments of transformation or creation of a good work.**
